• General description of the processing operation

The Moot Court competitions are a recruitment and outreach initiative organised in collaboration with law Faculties and student organisations in the EEA EFTA states. The aim is to build interest in and awareness of EEA law amongst students in the EEA EFTA states in order that they may apply to join ESA in the future and/or pursue a career in EEA law in their home country.

Participants' personal data is collated with their written submissions in order that feedback can be sought from them after the competition.

Competition winners are invited on a study trip to visit the EFTA & EU institutions, which is organised by ESA and which necessitates the collation of personal information.

Participant feedback is collected via email after the competitions and study trips and ESA regularly updates a "Moot Alumni Tracker" spreadsheet logging the professional development and contact details of former participants. Feedback is also collated from those involved as Law Faculty members, coaches and judges.

Promotional photography is carried out during competitions and study visits for the purposes of promoting competitions.

• Automated / Manual operations

Participants manually complete the contact details information form when submitting their written pleadings.

Feedback respondents complete an online questionnaire, which is submitted to HR electronically.

Moot Court winners complete a "Personal Information Form" manually and submit this, along with a scanned copy of their passport, by email to HR.

Storage

Personal data is stored in hard copy in a restricted access filing cabinet and/or in a restricted access case in ESA's document management system (GoPro).

Promotional photographs are stored electronically in GoPro and are accessible to HR staff, along with those staff involved in the organisation of the competition. They may also be published on ESA's website and in promotional material and shared with Faculties and student organisations for the purposes of promoting the competitions.

• Security measures

Personal data stored in hard copy is kept in locked cabinets, with the keys being available to HR & Finance.

Personal data in GoPro is access restricted to HR and Finance and certain non-HR staff members involved with the Moot Court project.

Promotional photographs are stored electronically in GoPro and are accessible to HR and IT staff, along with those staff involved in the organisation of the competition. They may also be published on ESA's website and in promotional material and shared with Faculties and student organisations for the purposes of promoting the competitions.

Feedback is collected and ESA regularly updates a "Moot Alumni Tracker" spreadsheet for the purposes of continuous improvement and understanding the impact of the competition on recruitment and outreach.

To enable and facilitate the logistical arrangements of study visits, personal data is collated and shared with EFTA/EU institutions, who require this in order to meet their internal security requirements and accept visitors. This may also include personal data of ESA staff, who accompany the winners on the study visit.

Promotional photos are retained for five years.
