

Form for withdrawal of an alert

Step 1: An alert should be withdrawn only if you become aware that the criteria for sending the alert were not fulfilled at the time it was sent/ if the Member State who initiated the alert becomes aware that the alert was based on wrong or unfounded evidence.

Are you sure that in this case the criteria for sending the alert were not fulfilled when you sent the alert?

→ go to step two
