EFTA SURVEILLANCE AUTHORITY DECISION

of 1 March 2023

closing a complaint case arising from an alleged failure by Norway to comply with Article 28 of the EEA Agreement and Directive 2004/38/EC by not ensuring the right for third-country national family members to work while awaiting the issuance of a residence card

THE EFTA SURVEILLANCE AUTHORITY

Having regard to the Agreement between the EFTA States on the Establishment of a Surveillance Authority and a Court of Justice, in particular Article 31 thereof,

Whereas:

On 7 August 2017, the EFTA Surveillance Authority ("the Authority") received a complaint against Norway alleging that Norway did not in practice ensure the possibility for third-country national ("TCN") family members of returning Norwegian nationals to work while awaiting the issuance of a residence card, as provided under Article 28 of the EEA Agreement and Directive 2004/38/EC¹ ("Directive 2004/38" or "the Directive").

On 17 August 2017, the Internal Market Affairs Directorate of the Authority ("the Directorate") sent a letter of acknowledgement to the complainant, explaining that the issues raised in the complaint were closely connected with the issues assessed by the Directorate in an own-initiative case (*Case 80333 – The issuance of tax cards to EEA nationals and third-country national family members*) and that, therefore, the Directorate intended to further pursue those issues in the context of that case solely.²

Since then, the Directorate has engaged in extensive correspondence with the Norwegian Government to further assess whether Norway, in practice, hinders or in any manner restricts the eligible EEA nationals and their TCN family members from moving to Norway from another EEA State, and, when applicable, to work or engage in another lawful activity from the day of arrival, contrary to Article 28 of the EEA Agreement and Directive 2004/38.

Based on its initial assessment, the Directorate identified a few issues that indicated that the internal procedures were not fully in line with EEA law. However, in the course of the assessment of the case, the Norwegian Government has made various amendments to its internal rules, routines and practices, as well as an amendment to the National

Register Regulation of 14 July 2017 No 1201.³ According to the Norwegian Government, these measures are all designed to ensure that EEA nationals and their TCN family members can exercise their rights to work from the day of arrival in Norway.

Following a detailed assessment of the aforementioned measures, the Directorate concluded that the issues raised in Case 80333 were sufficiently addressed and, therefore, decided that the case be closed.⁴

By letter of 17 October 2022, the Directorate informed the complainant of its intention to propose to the Authority that this case be closed.⁵ The complainant was invited to submit any observations on Directorate's assessment of the complaint or present any new information by 17 November 2022.

The complainant did not reply to that letter.

There are, therefore, no grounds for pursuing this case further.

HAS ADOPTED THIS DECISION:

The complaint case arising from an alleged failure by Norway to comply with Article 28 of the EEA Agreement and Directive 2004/38/EC, is hereby closed.
